

HOW IT WORKS ?

Steps to Apply for Patent Registration

1. Determine Patentability:

Ensure your invention is new, non-obvious, and useful. Conduct a preliminary patent search to check if similar inventions exist.

2. Prepare Required Documents:

- **Detailed Description:** Clearly describe your invention, including its purpose and functionality.
- **Claims:** Define the scope of what you are claiming as your invention.
- **Drawings/Diagrams:** Include any necessary diagrams or drawings that illustrate your invention.
- **Proof of Identity:** Provide identification and address proof (e.g., PAN card, Aadhaar).

3. File the Patent Application:

- **Choose the Type of Patent:** Decide whether you want a provisional patent (temporary protection while you refine your invention) or a complete patent application.
- **Submit Application:** File your application with the relevant patent office (in India, it's the Indian Patent Office) either online or via physical submission.
- **Application Fee:** Pay the applicable fees, which vary based on the type of application and applicant category (individual, startup, etc.).

4. Patent Examination:

After filing, your application will be examined by a patent examiner. They may raise objections or request clarifications. You must respond to these objections within the specified time frame.

5. Publication of Application:

Your application will be published in the Patent Journal after 18 months from the filing date, making it public. You can request early publication if desired.

6. Grant of Patent:

If the patent office is satisfied with your application and any objections have been resolved, they will grant the patent, giving you exclusive rights to your invention for a specified period (usually 20 years).

7. Maintain the Patent:

Pay maintenance fees periodically to keep your patent active. Failure to do so may result in the patent lapsing.

- **Consult a Patent Attorney:** It's advisable to work with a patent attorney or agent who can guide you through the complexities of patent law and ensure your application is complete and accurate.
- **Keep Records:** Maintain detailed records of your invention process, including prototypes, testing, and development, as this can be useful if disputes arise.
